Beginning at the W. middle angle of Queen Emma's Puunui, at a point O, N. 76° W. line, 435 ft from the triangulated North corner of Kukuiaeo, and running

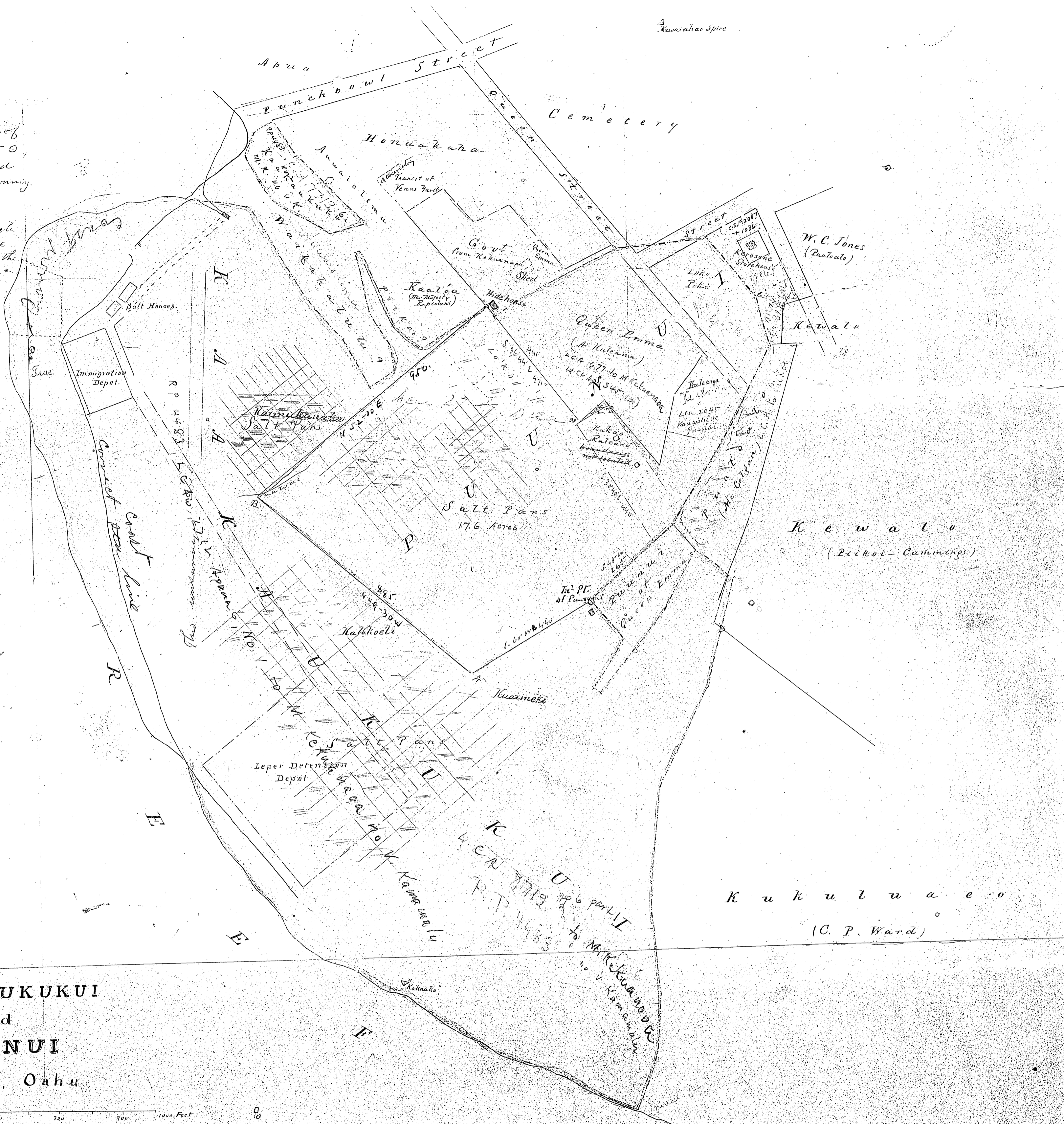
S. 60° W. line 440 feet

N. 49° 30' W. line 885 "

N. 52° or 6. " 950 " to the E angle of lot known as Kaalaa, thence around by the N.E. by the lines of the original Kaakaukukui survey to initial point.

All within this line is claimed as Puunui of the Government.

N.B. The large dotted Red Line is the line of Webster's Survey of Kaakaukukui embodied in the Land Commission Award No. 7713. The uniform testimony, however, of the natives resident on the land is to the effect that the Ili Puunui, which was a Govt Land, had its limits as indicated on this Map.
